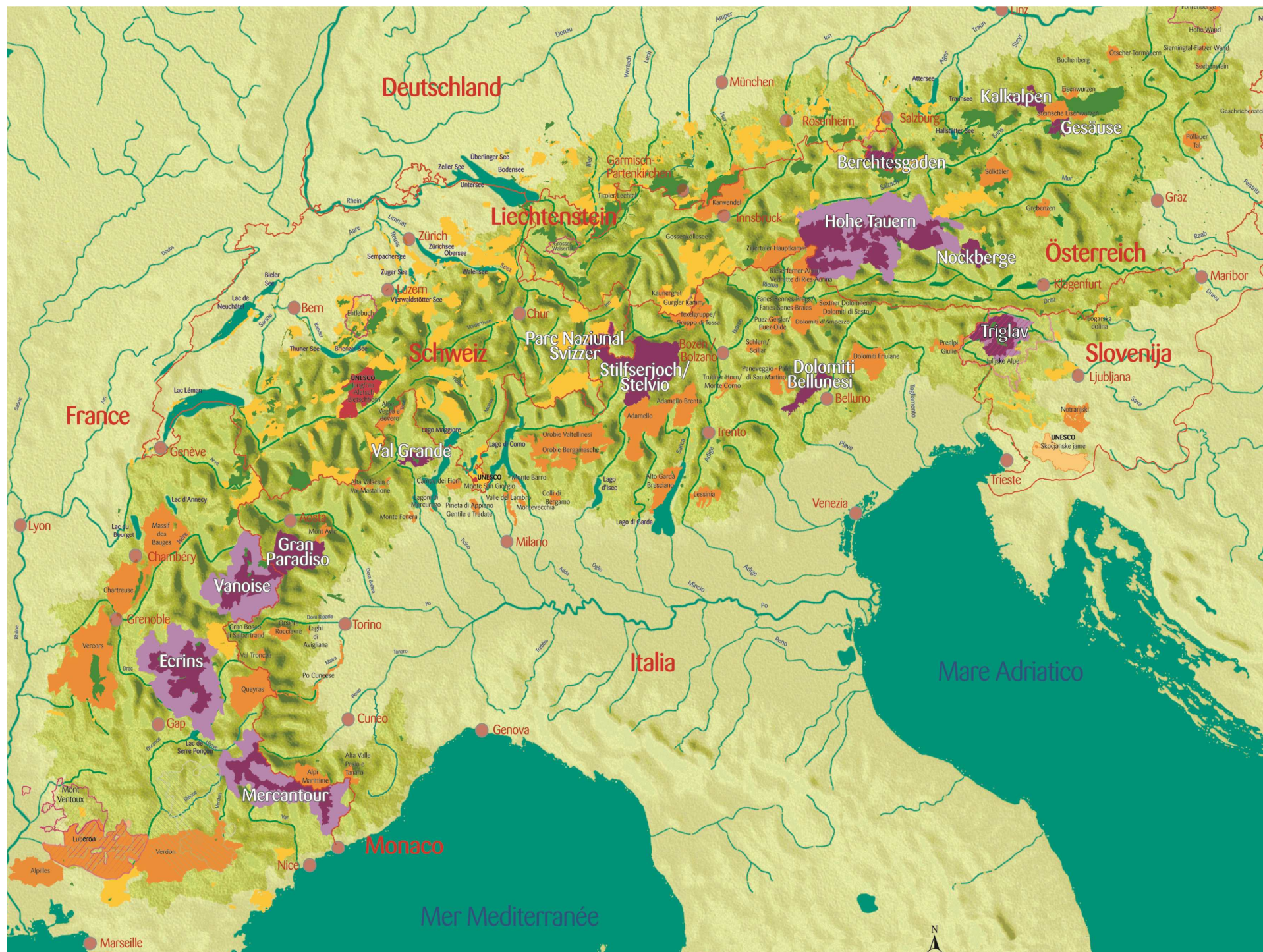

The discussion rounds on each subject should pursue the following questions:

- What are the **framework conditions in peripheral regions** that characterise their current situation and which ones will in future be necessary for the change desired?
- What are the **framework conditions/external influences** and how can they be **changed** in order to promote the desired form of development in peripheral regions?
- Are there regions that have **greater opportunities per se** for sustainable regional development and what are the reasons for this?
- Who are the **most important stakeholders and contact partners** who can bring about the desired changes?
- How can the **motivation and self-initiative** of the inhabitants of peripheral regions and of local decision-makers be strengthened?
- What is the relationship of **quality of life to traditions and innovation**? What are the necessary framework conditions for traditions and innovation to co-exist alongside one another?
- Gather good **examples** for each of the four subjects
- Suggest suitable **model regions** for each of the four subjects or for the entire subject matter
